Yesterday Cheshire Fire Service visited our key stage 2 children to complete some work on fire safety and what to do in the event of a fire. The children were impeccably behaved and were incredibly sensible when in the 'smoke tent'.

Parent/Carer Survey

Many thanks to all parents who completed the parent survey last



month. The feedback was overwhelmingly positive, with **99%** of parents and carers agreeing with the statements that Alsager Highfields was a good school, that was well-led and that they were proud for their children to attend it.

It is always heartening to read positives about the school, but equally the surveys are vital for me to identify the areas in which we can improve further and to gauge whether areas highlighted in past surveys have been successfully addressed. Communication between school and home has come out much more favourably this year , however comments about streamlining communication methods are acknowledged and we are currently looking at possible solutions to this.

PE uniform was also an area highlighted by many this year and I totally concur with all comments about the quality and appearance of the coloured PE t-shirts. As you know, we have been trying to source a green and black PE top, similar to the staff shirts, but this search has been unsuccessful. Therefore we have made the decision to go with a bottle green polo shirt with the school logo on. School will purchase a shirt for each child and we hope to provide these this term.

Finally, the range and amount of after-school clubs for younger pupils was highlighted. As the number of classes has reduced at Highfields, the number of staff available to take clubs has also inevitably reduced. Clubs are not a statutory duty for teachers, but are run through goodwill, however we are looking at ways in which we can expand the current offer.

<u>Maths</u>

Over the years, the way school teaches maths to pupils has changed significantly and as a parent it can be difficult to support your child when you are unfamiliar with new methods.

Mrs Dyde has therefore updated the school website under the' Our Curriculum' tab in the maths section. On this page you can now access the Maths No problem calculation policy which clearly sets out how we teach each area of the curriculum.

NSPCC Number Day



On the 2nd of February we are taking part in the NSPCC number day. Children are invited to come in their own clothes (number themed if they wish) for the donation of £1. All children in years 2-6 will be taking part in a TTRS inter-school competition, so any practice on times tables would be welcomed, as we all know how competitive I am!

Mobile Phones



We know as the year progresses, many pupils in years five and six start to walk home and we actively encourage this in order to prepare for High

school. As a parent it is always good to know where your child is and that they can be contacted if needed. For this reason, we do encourage your child to bring a mobile phone into school if walking home alone. Phones <u>MUST</u> be handed in at the office at the start of the day and picked up before going home. If your child attends an after-school club, then phones will be collected at the end of the day by the adult running the club.

Staff Fundraiser

Money raised will be split between the annexe outdoor area and the main school.
