
We have enjoyed the special month of December with the beautiful decorations all around the home. We had five Christmas trees in our lounges and dining rooms!

Ann told us "She loved the fact the children enjoyed football as much as she does!"








Christmas cake at Lawton Manor December 2020










Resident Edith on her 100th Birthday-November 2020
